1. There is a test of righteousness

(Romans 10:1-4)

- a) You will choose to serve God's righteousness or your own (vs. 3)
- b) You will trust in the fulfillment of righteousness in Jesus or in the law of righteousness (vs. 4)

God lets you choose what righteousness you will trust.

2. You are expected to act on your belief in righteousness

(Romans 10:5-13)

- a) The law of righteousness requires that you always live by that law (vs. 5)
- b) The righteousness that comes by faith is found in Jesus whom God freely gave to us (vs. 6-8)
- c) The word of faith confesses Jesus as Lord. It is a statement of His deity and our devotion to Him (vs. 9) (Deuteronomy 6:4-5)

- d) The word of faith believes that God raised Jesus from the dead (a confirmation of His deity and His righteousness) (vs. 9)
- e) With the heart man believes resulting in righteousness and with the mouth he confesses resulting in salvation (vs. 10-13)

3. God and His righteousness can be found

(Romans 10:14-21)

- a) God sends His people to share the news of Jesus with others (vs. 14-17)
- b) Like creation, the news about Jesus has gone out and men have rejected it (vs. 18-21) (Romans 1:18-20)
