1. The extent of Israel's rejection

(Romans 11:1-10)

- a) Not all Jews have rejected Jesus. God has His remnant (vs. 1-5)
- b) God's grace prevents a total rejection from occurring (vs. 6-10)

Because of God's power to "keep," Israel has not been removed from God's promises and plan.

2. The purpose of Israel's rejection

(Romans 11:11-24)

- a) By the transgression of the Jews, salvation has come to the Gentiles (vs. 12)
- b) God desires that all people have faith in His promises and value His kindness (vs. 19-23)

Israel's rejection has brought God's kindness and privilege to the Gentiles (Genesis 22:18).
