2. The importance of the resurrection

1 Corinthians 15:12-19, 29-34

- b) If Christ has not been raised, our faith is worthless and we are still in our sins (vs. 16-18)
- c) If Christ has not been raised, we can live as we want (vs. 29-34)

3. The order of the resurrection

1 Corinthians 15:20-28

 - b) Those who are Christ's are raised at His coming (vs. 23)
 - c) After the reign of Jesus, death will be abolished (vs. 24-28) (Revelation 20:4-5)
